Greetings Lamb of God,

Jan commented the other day how our lives feel like Groundhog Day. He meant the movie. I have to laugh a little because I can't remember exactly when he said it. For those of you who haven't seen it, Bill Murray wakes up every morning at 6 AM February 2nd 1993 in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. Everything and everyone around him seems to reset and only he is aware this is happening. When it first starts he is dubious. But when he's sure it's actually happening, he takes advantage of it. He steals, seduces and generally behaves like there's no tomorrow, and no consequences. After a while, this becomes old for him, but he still can't escape. He starts to despair.

His despair grows until he loses hope completely and commits suicide. Repeatedly. I say repeatedly because despite the fact that he drives off a cliff, drops a toaster into his bath, steps in from of a bus, jumps off a building and who knows what else, he still wakes up unharmed 6 o'clock the "next" morning.

When he realizes that even death will not allow him to escape this existence, the film takes a turn. Murray's character begins to find happiness in helping other people. By the end of the film, he has made his way around the whole town, changing tires, performing the Heimlich, and catching kids as they fall out of trees. He's found peace in this existence. Even if he never escapes, he's a changed man, finding joy in helping others. The film ends with him waking up to February 3rd, a new day, where he has presumably learned a lesson he will take forward from this point.

The film avoids asking who is causing this to happen. Murray sees a doctor and a psychologist, and even wonders if he, himself is God. Andie McDowell's character emphatically tells him no, but no more is said about the divine role in this situation. The viewer is left to figure that out for themselves. It also stops before the viewer has a chance to ask, "Won't he get tired of helping people too?" The message seems to be that living a selfish self-absorbed life will not make you happy. True happiness is found in helping others and we'd all figure this out given enough time. Unfortunately, we just run out of time before we get the chance. There's more than a grain of truth in this, but unfortunately, it misses a greater

Probably not Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania though.



News From NEHLM—Haiti Updates (May 16 & 28, 2020)

May 16, 2020

Greetings in the Name of our Victorious Risen Lord who assure us that "Because I live you will live also" (John 14:19b). Alleluia!

On my recent call with Rev. Paul, we talked about some general issues of church, family, ministry, etc. I then asked, "And how are you doing?" He responded, "We are doing very well." He was upbeat and energetic with the issues that are before them. This upbeat approach reminded me of my evening devotions from Philippians, "I have learned in whatever situation to be content...I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:11, 13). May we all receive the Lord's strength as He distributes it through the Word and Sacraments.

He explained that "Mommie" (His wife, Clynie) is busy managing food and living necessities for the girls' and boys' homes as well as caring for other workers. There is a fairly severe food insecurity situation in their community and efforts are being made to support them in their time of

need. Yves Thelamarque (the school administrator and pastor for the Baja Church) is busy caring for his church as well as supporting teachers the best he can.

Rev. Paul shared that the government officials are trying to say he owes more taxes for running a school. He explained to them that he has paid and the next payment is not due until September. We discussed the challenging concept of schools being charged taxes as they are educating the youth of the country for no cost to the country.

The rain they received in the last two weeks did allow for some agricultural pursuits to begin. "That rain was a blessing, but it had been real, real dry for three months. We need more rain." Please pray for healthy rain to fall on their land (and ours) as we are in this time of growth of agricultural products.

Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission(NEHLM) has encouraged Rev. Paul to provide some economic stimulus with a construction project. This allows church members, children at their homes, and community people to be productively engaged as many other business opportunities that are not otherwise available. He said that the Haitian government is saying everything we be opened up by late June or July. This would allow them to get things ready for school in the fall (obtain curriculum, material to make uniforms, supplies, etc.). The construction project they have been working on for two and a half months is finishing the security wall around the school complex, where a worship center is planned. The school is located at the western edge of the property and had the wall already built on the west side and about half of the north wall. (Side note: a mission team that I was on in 2013 began the work of that wall.) The north and south walls now run the distance of the property.

There is an issue with the east wall (towards the river). Rev. Paul's workers provided a large easement on the east end for a small dirt road. However, in the time since they began the work, the government has determined to put in a "large boulevard with sidewalks on both sides." This large boulevard would also run through some houses of community members. Rev. Paul has been working diplomatically to avoid having the work on the east

wall destroyed, and has been speaking for his neighbors as well. He appreciates our prayers! Thank you.

The upside of this is, as Rev. Paul said, "With a large boulevard and sidewalks, I would want to put the worship site closer to that boulevard. This would be good having a big boulevard close to the church."

Rev. Paul shared that, with the current no-travel situation, he has not been able to get his eye medicine for glaucoma from the Dominican Republic. I asked how his eyes were doing. He responded, "My eyes are feeling OK, but I do not always get a real clear picture." May this hardship be solved soon.
