Hello Lamb of God,

Every year at the Zion Lutheran School graduation one of the association pastors speaks. This year is my turn, so I've been thinking about what to say. Some of these kids have come to ZLS recently, but others I've known since they were in fourth grade.

Few people probably remember anything that was said at their graduation, any of their graduations. That must be especially true for their 8th grade graduation. In one sense, that might take the pressure off, but in another that could lead to mailing it in, which doesn't feel right.

A while ago, someone convinced me that you would be lucky if kids you taught in Sunday school remembered one or two things you told them later in life. The time I spend in class with them is pretty similar to Sunday school, so I began to be very intentional about what I taught.

Over the past four years, I've come back time and time again to a few things: God knows you and loves you, the Bible is reliable, and life will be hard sometimes, but that doesn't change those first two things. We talked about other things as well, but every few weeks, I tried to come back to those few things. So what do I tell them on graduation night?

I asked my friend Bill that question and he told me that if I were going to tell them something new it would either be not important (and therefore not worth saying) or important (and therefore why would I have waited until now to say it). Either way, if I were to say something new to these kids, it would be failure on my part. I agree.

Many of us have limited exposure to people in our lives. Are we intentional about what we say to them? If I were to hunt down someone you used to know and ask them about you, what would they remember? Blessings, Pastor Mike

The border situation for Ouanaminthe, Haiti, and Dajabon, Dominican Republic, has improved a little. Truck drivers who are buying and transporting goods are able to cross. Other than this limited business access, there continues to be very little other movement across the border.

April 18, 2024

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission (NEHLM) Board met recently and is pursuing avenues to obtain regular support for education. I sent the Headmaster of the schools, Rev. Yves Thelemarque, a note asking for an accounting of staff for College Evangelique le Lutherien de Ouanaminthe (CELO-preschool through high school) and for the school at Baja (preschool through 6th grade). As I shared with Rev. Paul that I was working with Yves and that the board was concerned about getting the needed support for the schools, he responded faithfully, "God will do what is best for everyone."

An exciting opportunity is in process for one of the young men from the ministry. Rodley Augustave has been approved to come to the United States to be part of a Humanitarian Parole Program that can be up to two years. Other countries involved in this program are Cuba, Nicaragua, and Venezuela. Rodley has shown steadfastness in pursuing good opportunities, and we trust he will do this also on American soil. He was able to fly to Florida April 12th from Cap Haitien.

Rev. Paul reported that the problems due to Haiti's lack of government have settled down somewhat. As noted above, there are some international flights taking place. Gangs are still a big problem in Port au Prince; however, efforts are being made to set up a government.

April is normally Haiti's dry season, yet they have received some rain in the last week. Rev. Paul said, "Some of the young crops got washed away, but we are able to do gardening, which is unique for this time of year."

The attached picture is of a class of students at CELO. We are delighted to see people being instructed in knowledge to help them live in this world, and more importantly, being instructed in the Lord Jesus Christ and His kingdom. On the NEHLM website are pictures of two other classes of younger students.
