

#### FROM PASTOR MIKE:

Greetings Lamb of God,

Have you ever noticed how much easier it is to follow Jesus' teaching if we just tweak it a little? For instance, Luke 6:31 tells us, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." It's a line from Jesus that people know it even if they have no idea where it came from. Those who practice it, tend to treat it as the inverse of what it says: Don't do to others things you would not want them to do to you. park. There are literally billions of people I have not harmed in any way. Billions I have not hated, envied, slandered or stolen from. I'm not sure I actively plot harm against anyone.

But that's not what it says is it? This statement comes at the end of Jesus' command to love your enemies, and do good to those who hate you. Those aren't passive verbs. When Jesus says to love, He's not primarily talking about a feeling; He means behave in a loving way. Love is not the absence of active malice. "First, do no harm" is often quoted as part of the Hippocratic oath, but it's not. In fact, it's sometimes quoted as if it's the entire oath. Can you imagine? That's a lot of med school just to do no harm.

Doing good things for "bad" people is nearly unheard of in today's culture. It the film True Lies, Arnold Schwarzenegger plays a CIA agent who has kept his job secret from his family. Under the influence of truth serum, he is asked by his wife, "Have you killed people?" He responds, "Yeah, but they were all bad." It's a joke...sort of.

Is that where we should take our cues? Culture is always more than willing to point to people we don't have to treat well. But in that same passage, Jesus tells us that if we do good only for those who do good for us, that's nothing special. Everybody does that. But there's supposed to be something special about walking behind Jesus. Because He is pretty special. Can you imagine if God considered not doing harm to be equal to doing good?

What if God only sent the rain to good people? How dry would the world be? If He only sent sunshine to people who deserved it, who loved and followed Him, how dark would the world be?

Jesus isn't telling us how to feel. Which is not to say feeling is not important. Jesus is telling us how to behave, because He knows that if we live as if we love people we don't like, eventually it will change the way we feel. Still, this is not an easy task. Maybe we can start with prayer. Not that so-and-so gets what's coming to them. But that we might take a step toward generous, loving action which will lead to the kind of countercultural behavior that Jesus' kingdom is all about.

# NEWSFROM NEHLM

Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission

Greetings, January 31, 2025

Attached are some pictures from a team representing Hope for Haiti who blessed Rev. Daniel Paul's ministry as they brought over two tons of food, set up an eye clinic analyzing 182 patients and fitting 130 of them with glasses. They also did crafts with them, making tote bags, and played parachute games, etc. We are very thankful for other groups to join us in supporting this ministry. I am also pleased to hear the positive report they had concerning travel to and in Haiti. As Rev. Paul assures me, situations in north, northeast, and central Haiti are stable.

The young ladies attending university in the Dominican Republic are progressing in their studies. Jaccina is in her last term and will be graduating within two months with a degree in "Hoteling." Rev. Paul explained this as doing the business of running a hotel. Rev. Paul and Cliney's oldest daughter is also scheduled to graduate this year with a degree in Nutrition. A young lady who has shown great dedication is Benjennie; she is moving forward in her studies in the medical field (still on track to be a doctor). We are thankful for the ability to support the children of La Maison des Agneaux de Dieu Orphelinat (The House of the Lambs of God Orphanage) as they pursue careers. There are youth going to university elsewhere and others that work in the community and at the orphanage.







#### Greetings,

I had a video call with Rev. Paul today and showed him the snow that is piled up on our parking lot with more snow falling. He laughed and said, "Oh, I remember that when I was in Fort Wayne. It got real cold, down to the negative Fahrenheit degrees. Oh, how cold it was!" He says this as he is in his office with a light t-shirt, the temperature 81 degrees with their high at 91 degrees earlier in the day.

Rev. Paul reported their ongoing struggle of obtaining books and materials for all the classes for school. I have attached a video and photo of the older students using laptops that were purchased with NEHLM funds recently. These students share the laptops and take good care of them.

A young man (Maxo), who was raised in the boys' home and continues to work hard for the ministry, had an accident on a "three-wheeler" (motorcycle engine with a bed over two back wheels). He was on an errand to get wood. He had a couple of the younger boys with him, and one of the younger boys was hit in the head by some of the wood. He received medical care and is home now. He will have a follow up meeting with the doctor next week.




