

FROM PASTOR MIKE:

Greetings Lamb of God,

In John 4:27 Jesus tells His disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid."

Why the distinction? Jesus makes a point of telling them that the peace He gives is not normal, everyday peace like the world gives. What kind of peace is that?

It seems like worldly peace is usually defined by the absence of conflict, disturbance or even war. When we put it that way, it seems like a pretty low bar. A country not actively at war is not necessarily peaceful is it? How about when two or more countries are at war with each other but arrange a brief cease fire? If they arrange it in order to discuss terms of ending the war, that's great, but what if they are only asking in order to resupply and regroup enabling each side to return to killing each other more effectively? Is that a moment of peace?

To be fair, not being shot at is better than being shot at. A quiet moment is better than a shouting match. But are those really the only options? Jesus says they are not. The peace He offers is different. He tells the disciples not to let their hearts be troubled or afraid even though He made it clear they would have trouble, they would be persecuted because they followed Him.

The peace Jesus gives enables us to be untroubled in troubling circumstances. It lets us be undisturbed when things happening around us are disturbing. How exactly does this happen? I don't know. I think the more we trust and get to know God, the more trustworthy we find Him to be. But the process is unclear. It's not because some pastor tells you not to worry. It's not even because the Bible says it. Jesus just gives a special kind of peace to those who follow Him.

Paul wrote the church in Philippi, "And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:7)
It surpasses my understanding, but I know I want it. Don't you?

NEWS FROM NEHLM

Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission

April 11, 2025

Greetings in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, the "Suffering Servant" Who Has Paid the Price for Sin!

On a recent phone call Rev. Daniel Paul reported, "We are getting ready for Passion Week. It is an exciting time for us all. This is one of the few years that we do not have Baptismal candidates for Easter. There is a group being instructed for their baptisms in October, but none right now." These would be people old enough to be instructed first, then baptized. Infant baptism is the norm. It is delightful to know that they are baptizing infants from families already involved in the church and yearly, they have several "adult" baptisms. Praise be to God!

Rev. Paul shared that the children's agency of Haiti has brought this ministry six new children between four and eight years old (boys and girls). It would be nice to have new sponsors respond to this opportunity. Please contact NEHLM, and we will pursue getting you a picture of the child. We have kept the sponsorship for full time care at \$50 a month and appreciate unallocated gifts to help "Maintain this Ministry of Jesus Christ's Mission." (These are the 3 M's that I promote in thanksgiving for gifts to our local church and extended ministries.)

Rev. Paul reported, "We are starting our rainy season and got our first rain today (4/10/2025). We receive the most of our rain in May and June, but this will allow us to start planting."

The pictures are of their yearly "Ladies' Celebration Service." You will notice the limited space at the worship center with many people sitting behind Rev. Paul as he preaches, and in another picture, people on benches outside the worship building. He said, "We try to provide food at these special services because there are many people who are starving."

April 22, 2025

Greetings in the Name of Our Resurrected Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Rev. Daniel Paul sent the following greeting on Easter Sunday:

Alleluia Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia. Blessed Easter to all of you my friends. You and I, we partake in Christ's resurrection in our holy baptism, where we receive His justification and the forgiveness of sins. We do not need to fear death, for all our sins are forgiven. Let us rejoice. Happy Easter.

We are thankful for the opportunity to acquire some prescriptions that are almost impossible for them to obtain in Haiti. One of those prescriptions is for Rev. Paul's eyes to help with glaucoma and the other is for a resident in their home, Franceline, who requires medicines for her disabling condition. Our ability to do so is through medical professionals "walking along" with us to get the prescriptions and then having them sent by plane via an organization called "Missionary Flights International." We try to send a full box of other OTC medicines and vitamins that are beneficial for them when an order is sent.

Some members of Cliney's (Rev. Paul's wife) family have been displaced from their home between Port au Prince and the Central Plateau of Haiti. They recently found out that their houses were burned to the ground with all the furniture and belongings inside. We are thankful for them being able to leave before the damage but very sad with the conditions that continue, especially near Port au Prince.






